Dental management software

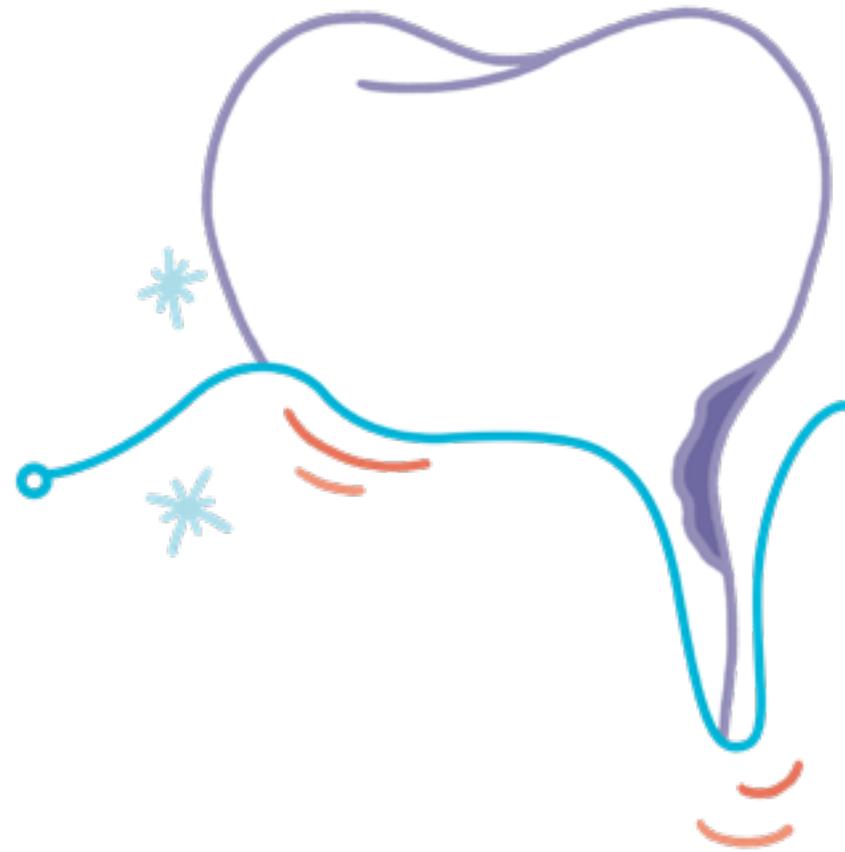

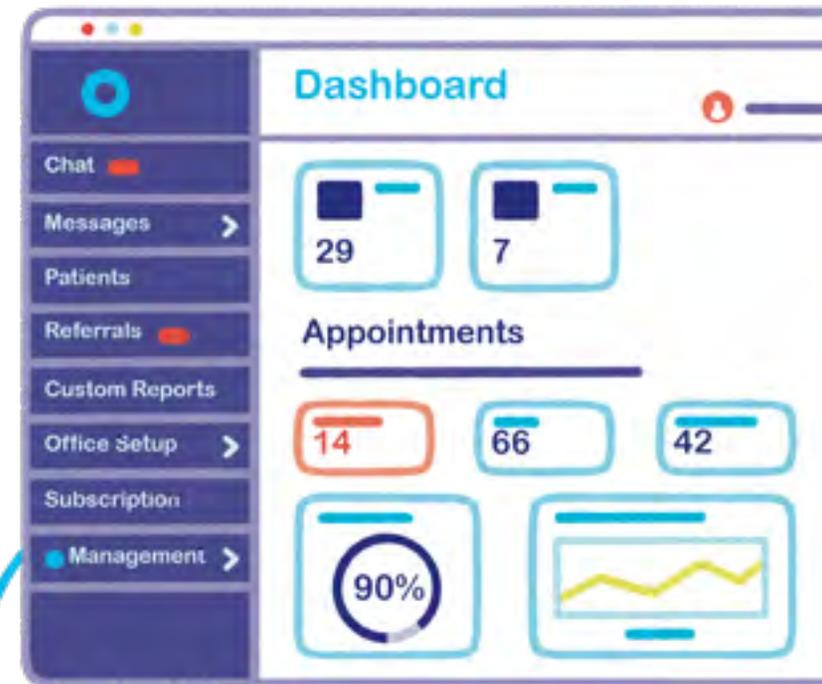
