# Staff Shortages in the Dental Industry



#### **Staff Shortages in the Dental Industry**

Staffing shortages have been on nearly every dental or oral surgery practice owner's mind in the last few years. This has been an ongoing trend, and is likely to stay one in the years to come. This has had a significant impact on practice owners and staff as they grapple with issues like burnout and lost revenue. In fact, in a recent report¹ 27% of practices said that staff shortages were one of the reasons that their appointment schedule wasn't full.

This means that dental and oral surgery practices have had to get creative when coping with staffing shortages. 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# Recruitment and Burnout



#### **Recruitment and Burnout**

Recruitment is a top challenge in 2024, with 60% of dentists saying that recruiting new staff is their top priority<sup>2</sup>.

While there are a lot of factors that contribute to staffing shortages at dental and oral surgery practices, the main one in recent years was the Covid-19 pandemic. This is not unique to dentistry. Many healthcare workers have gotten burnt out and left their profession, especially in the early pandemic. It has been an incredibly challenging, constantly changing time in healthcare, with stress levels rising for everyone in the profession.

In dental and oral surgery settings, dental assistants and dental hygienists are experiencing especially high dissatisfaction with their professional lives. Earlier in the pandemic, one report noted that 43.1% of dental assistants and 66.8% of dental hygienists in the U.S. who were no longer working the field had left their positions voluntarily. Among the reasons listed for job dissatisfaction were unsatisfactory pay<sup>3</sup>.

One of the main reasons that dental assistants and dental hygienists are choosing to leave the profession is burnout. In fact, about 1 in 3 dental assistants and hygienists report that part of their reasons for leaving their job was being overworked, in addition to poor workplace culture<sup>4</sup>.

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## How Automation is Covering the Gap



#### **How Automation is Covering the Gap**

Many practices are starting to leverage automation in order to mitigate the effects of staff shortages. Here are a few ways they are using technology and automation:

- Digital forms. Digital forms are a common way practices use technology to save time. Not only can automating waivers, pre- and post-procedure instructions, and other forms increase efficiency, but it also means that less forms are lost because patients always have them accessible on their phone or computer. Digital forms also allow patients to fill out forms on their own time, rather than eating into appointment time.
- Reminders. Automating reminders takes a lot of the administrative burden off of staff members at dental and oral surgery practices. This also decreases the need to make phone calls, giving back a significant amount of time to staff.

- Mass messaging. Similarly, mass messaging allows staff
  to reach many patients at one time. This is a great way to
  communicate anything from sudden closures to parking
  notifications and can also be leveraged for marketing
  purposes!
- Waitlist. Virtual waitlists allow you to quickly and easily fill in your practices' appointment schedule when there are cancellations, automatically notifying patients if there is an opening.


While the staffing shortage may not be solvable overnight, technology can help fill the gap and help practices meet their patients' expectations.









